Unintentionally Impaired? Learn how your medication can affect your driving.

No matter your age, if you're behind the wheel, you have a responsibility to drive safely. Drugs and medication, including those legally prescribed, have the potential to increase your risk of getting into a collision.

Different types of medication can impact your abilities behind the wheel.

Stimulants	 Reduces balance and coordination Reduces impulse control Increases risk-taking behaviours
Opioids	 Slows reaction time Reduces ability to divide attention and follow instructions Slows driving
Sedatives	 Impairs motor coordination and slows reaction time Decreases attentiveness and ability to divide attention

Drug-impaired driving is against the law and carries the same criminal consequences as alcoholimpaired driving. Talk to your doctor to understand how your medication may affect you.
