

Dealer's Permit Application Checklist

Before submitting your Application for Dealer's Permit, please ensure that you have done the following:

Fully complete your <u>Application for Dealer's Permit</u>.

Include your original dealer surety bond signed in the applicant's name.

- Bond obligee (payable to): Minister of Finance for the Province of Manitoba
- Bond can be obtained from an insurance broker
- Surety bonds are not insurance, they are guarantees of performance. A bond demonstrates to prospective clients that you are technically and financially capable of completing your contracts.

<u>If operating OUTSIDE The City of Winnipeg</u>, include your written operating location approval from the local government (e.g. Rural Municipality, Town, Village, etc.).

- Documents must prove that the applicant can conduct <u>vehicle sales</u> at the chosen operating location. This may be in the form of a letter on applicable local government letterhead.
 - Applicants operating within The City of Winnipeg will have their operating location(s) internally verified by Vehicle Safety.

Ensure that you have successfully registered your corporation and / or business operating name with the <u>Manitoba Companies Office</u>, and ensure that all corporate and / or business name registrations are active and up to date.

• All applicants will have their corporate and / or business name registration status verified with the Companies Office by Vehicle Safety.

If applying as a corporation, ensure that you already have a Manitoba Public Insurance customer account set up for the corporation.

• If you still need to do this, attend an <u>MPI Service Centre</u> or an <u>Autopac Broker</u> with the articles of incorporation.

Successfully complete the Dealer's Knowledge Test.

• You can make an appointment to take the Dealer's Knowledge Test by visiting an <u>MPI Service Centre</u> or the J.W. Zacharias Physical Damage Research Centre (1981 Plessis Road, Winnipeg), or by calling 204-985-7000 (toll-free 1-800-665-2410).

Include a \$600.00 payment payable to Manitoba Public Insurance.

• Complete and attach the <u>Credit Card Authorization form</u>, or a cheque payable to Manitoba Public Insurance.
